Identify hazards. Walk through areas to look for things that can create unnecessary risks for exposure.

Is hand sanitizer available in waiting rooms and common areas of the department?

Are disinfecting materials available in locations where there is shared equipment? Is equipment wiped down after every use (phones, printers, fax machines, etc.)?					
Do workers wear appropriate PPE (including face masks for non clinical workers)? Do staff members wash and/or sanitize their hands after contact with shared surfaces?					
Are signs placed in the department waiting room notifying patients and visitors to wear face masks?					
Is physical distancing maintained in department waiting rooms and common areas? Are patients at least 6 feet apart while seated and waiting in line?					
Are physical barriers, such as plexiglass shields, present at department registration/ reception stations where staff and patients may be in close contact?					
Are precautions in place to prevent staff moving from COVID-19 high-impact areas to other parts of the hospital?
